

Fr. Fintan Gavin Newly Ordained Bishop of Cork

Fintan Gavin was born in Dublin in 1966 and baptised in St. Andrews Parish, Westland Row. His family roots are in Marino, St. Vincent de Paul Parish.

Fintan was ordained to serve as a priest of the Archdiocese of Dublin by Bishop Eamon Walsh on 7th June 1991.

His first appointments were as Teacher/Chaplain at schools in Bray and Tallaght.

In 1996 he undertook post-graduate studies in Rome. In 2003 he was awarded a Doctorate in Canon Law from the Pontifical Georgian University, Rome.

In 2003 Fintan was appointed Vice-Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Dublin and was appointed Chancellor in 2017.

Fr. Paul Coyle joined Fintan as Assistant to the Chancellor while also serving his time here as Co-PP. Fintan remained Chancellor up to the time of his appointment to the Diocese of Cork and Ross.
