On October 4th, on the feast of St. Francis, from the town of Assisi, Pope Francis sent a very special message to the Church Worldwide all about Love and Attention - the kind of attention that brings a bleeding world back to health. It is a social meditation on the Good Samaritan who recognises Love and Attention as the supreme law. The notion that all created life shares it's origin in God, and that in Christ we become Sisters and Brothers, bonded in dignity, care, and friendship, is one of the oldest social teachings of Christianity.

Shortly after becoming Pope, Pope Francis wrote to us:

"I invite all Christians, everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ, or at least an openness to letting Him encounter them; I ask all of you to do this unfailingly each day"

Trying to live out that encounter, we see our Brothers and Sisters in a different way and we strive to care for the earth, OUR COMMON HOME.



World Mission Sunday 18th October

Next weekend is World Mission Sunday. We are a Worldwide/Universal/Catholic Church. We are together Sisters and Brothers in Christ. Some of our church communities are in great need and we would like to support and help them.

18²⁰²⁰ Collections at Mass in over 120 countries will be offered to support the life-giving work of missionaries. However, this direct appeal from Pope Francis is in jeopardy.

Our pandemic restrictions mean that at present nobody can physically attend Mass, resulting in empty baskets. The implications for suffering overseas communities in the months ahead will be devastating.
