Pope Francis' vision for lay ministry in the Church (April 25 2023) ... continued from last week Pope Francis says:

"All ministries are an expression of the sole mission of the Church, and they are all forms of service to others. All forms of ecclesial/church tasks have in common "the willingness to serve our sisters and brothers and, in them, to serve Christ."

Referring to the apostolic exhortation (Encyclical) 'Evangelii Gaudium' he added, 'Only in this way may all the baptised be able to discover the meaning of their own life, joyfully experiencing being a mission on this earth, that is being called, in different ways and forms bringing light, blessing, enlivening, raising up, healing and freeing, and letting themselves be accompanied."

The Origin Of Ministries

In his speech Pope Francis sought to differentiate **"instituted"** ministries from the ministries carried out in activities of an ordinary, everyday nature, in the life of the Church and in the world. To live and carry out a ministry, he said, is to participate in the "prophetic and regal function of Christ, not only within the Church, but also in the environments in which they are engaged.
