Extracts from one of Pope Francis' homilies (World Youth Day, Lisbon 2023)



"There is space in the Church for everyone... everyone, everyone, everyone!" "For everyone, para todos," No one is useless; no one is superfluous; there is room for everyone. Just as we are, everyone... 'But Father, I am a wretch; I am a sinner: is there room for me?' There is room for everyone." For, "God loves us; God loves us as we are, not as we wish to be or as society expects us to be: as we are. He loves us with our flaws, limitations, and desires to progress in life.

God calls us in this way: have faith because God is a father, and he is a loving father, a father who loves us." Look at Zacchaeus in the Gospel. Jesus looks at him first, loves him first, and invites Himself to his home, regardless of the scandalized comments from onlookers.

The Church has room for everyone, just as it did for Zacchaeus. His was an unprecedented surprise, a free gift, bestowed purely by grace.

Jesus' gaze, His call, turned Zacchaeus's life upside down: because he was loved like never before.

What else do we need if not Someone to embrace us as we are, making us feel special, wanted, loved, and forgiven? What else do we need if not to be assured: there is room for us too, regardless of our circumstances?

<u>Dublin Diocesan Pilgrimage To Lourdes. Associate Membership of the Pilgrimage Annual Appeal</u>



Since the beginning of the Dublin Diocesan Pilgrimage 74 years ago, thousands of people have travelled with the help of volunteers and have experienced the comfort and the grace of being in the presence of Our Lady; and for volunteers, young and old, their experience of travelling with the sick has often been life changing.

The funds from the annual Associate Membership appeal helps subsidise the cost of bringing a sick pilgrim to Lourdes. At present, we ask each sick pilgrim to contribute €590.00 towards the cost of his or her travel and stay.

We never refuse an application on the grounds of the person not being able to afford this sum. The actual cost per sick pilgrim is over €1,000.

We are appealing to all parishes for support in helping us raise the much needed funds towards these subsidies.
