Archbishop welcomes launch of 'A Safe and Welcoming Church

(Extract from the Child Safeguarding & Protection Service August Newsletter)



ARCHBISHOP FARRELL has welcomed the launch, in June of this year, of A Safe and Welcoming Church. Published by the National Board for Safeguarding Children in the Catholic Church in Ireland (the 'National Board'), this is the new 'One Church' child safeguarding policy for the Catholic Church in Ireland.

A Safe and Welcoming Church differs from the policy it replaces, Safeguarding Children, in several important respects. The new title A Safe and Welcoming Church is an acknowledgement that we have a different understanding of the role of safeguarding now from when Safeguarding Children was first launched in 2008. At that time, the Church was responding to a crisis brought about by disclosures of the abuse of children by priests and religious, and of abuse in Church run institutions, and the failure of Church authorities to respond appropriately to these disclosures.

Safeguarding, we have come to understand, ought not to be just seen as a reaction to untoward and traumatic events. It is fundamentally part of who we are as followers of Jesus Christ. Safeguarding is rooted in gospel values, scripture and Church teaching.


