WORDS OF POPE FRANCIS ON TODAY'S GOSPEL - MARK 10:46-52

Bartimaeus' faith is evident from his prayer. It is not a timid and standard prayer. First and foremost, he calls the Lord "Son of David": that is, he acknowledges Jesus as the Messiah, the King who would come into the world. Then he calls Him by name, confidently; "Jesus". He is not afraid of Him, he does not stay at a distance. And thus, from the heart, he shouts out his entire drama to God, his friend: "Have mercy on me"! Just that prayer: "Have mercy on me"! He does not ask for some loose change as he does with passers-by. No. He asks for everything from the One who can do everything. He asks people for loose change; he asks everything from Jesus who can do everything.

"Have mercy on me, have mercy on all that I am".

May Bartimaeus, with his genuine, insistent and courageous faith, be an example for us.

Fr. Richard Rohr considers what we can learn from the first Bible of nature.

The first act of divine revelation is creation itself. The first Bible is the Bible of nature. It was written at least 13.8 billion years ago, at the moment that we call the Big Bang,

long before the Bible of words. "Ever since God created the world, God's everlasting power and divinity – however invisible – are there for the mind to see in the things that God has made." (Romans 1:20). One really wonders how we missed that. Words gave us something to argue about, I guess, while nature can only be experienced, and hopefully enjoyed and respected with admiration and awe.

Don't' dare put the second Bible in the hands of people who have not sat lovingly at the feet of the first Bible. They will invariably manipulate, mangle, and murder the written text.
