Pope Francis writes that hope is a gift from God and a task that must be cultivated by all Christians. Hope is a GIFT because it is God who offers it to us. Hope is waiting for something that has already been given to us: salvation in God's eternal and infinite love. Hope is also a TASK that Christians have a duty to cultivate and put to good use for the sake of all their brothers and sisters.

I invite every reader of this text to make a simple but concrete gesture: in the evening, before going to bed, as you're thinking over the events you have lived through and the encounters you have had, go in search of a sign of hope in the day just gone by. A smile from someone you didn't expect, an uncalled for act observed at school or at home, a kind act encountered in the workplace, a gesture of help, even a small one ...

Let us train ourselves to recognise hope. We will then be able to marvel at how much good exists in the world. And our hearts will light up with hope. We will then be able to be beacons of the future for those around us.

Small Change, an arts project engaging residents in Ennel and Inagh Court was supported by the 2024 dlr Creative Places bursary award to Blue Drum. In June, door to door conversations helped identify ideas and people with energy for the area one-minute from their doorstep. These conversations resulted in the creation of a 'Courts Tour' to express the pulse of its people, stories and the unique 1970s public housing architecture and landscape. Other courts got involved too. Sandra Kelly, dlr Senior Community Officer has agreed to meet with community groups and residents shortly. She will also organise a walkability audit of the paths within the Courts to include Glencar and Sheelin and prioritise locations that need attention. This work could be part of the 50th Anniversary celebrations!

Construction of the Courts took place over two phases as follows: Inagh Court, Cypress Court, Holly Court & Ennel Court in 1978; and Cedar Court & Glencar Court in 1979.
